FROM THE PASTOR

From Pastor Lisa Nelson:

My week at Holy Trinity starts on Mondays when I begin studying the upcoming Sunday's assigned readings. These readings are called the Lectionary, which is 3 years' worth of readings from the Bible that are on a 3 year cycle. On Tuesdays, I go to text study, on zoom since the pandemic, where a group of us pastors talk about those readings for Sunday. This is a great help because our thoughts help create sermon possibilities.

After I write up my notes from text study, I head to Holy Trinity for office hours. This gives me and Holly, our secretary, a chance to look at bulletins and other important things. Holly is wonderful by the way! I also get to visit with anyone who stops by, lead the monthly WELCA Bible Study, and get ready for our monthly council meetings, among other things.

On Wednesday mornings, I write my sermon, which can take quite a while, as you can imagine. Later that day, I go back to Holy Trinity for my 5:15 office hour where I get ready for worship, spend some time with the confirmation students, preach and lead worship. We have had anywhere from 15 to 21 people worshipping on Wednesdays. And later during the week, I rework the sermon because it's not done until Sunday.

There are other things that need to be done during the week, such as visiting or calling people, including those unable to get out to church. I also come up with a children's message for Sunday, and of course, try to keep up with emails and synod activities. Finally, Sunday arrives! I take one last look at the sermon, and then I get to lead worship and preach for and with you all!

This "job" is about connecting with people and creating opportunities for people to connect—with each other and with Jesus. I also work 15 hours a week at St Mark's Lutheran Church in Madison and am a life coach. In addition to my own coaching clients, I coach for Awaken Dane, a non-profit that helps congregations connect with people beyond their church walls.)

I'm sure there are tasks I've forgotten to mention, but this covers a lot. I have really enjoyed getting to meet all of you and look forward to meeting more people as time goes by. If I haven't met you yet, please stop by during office hours or worship or arrange for another time with me. I'd love to meet you!

<u>Council Minutes from September, 2024 Were Reviewed</u> Karen made a motion to approve the minutes. Second by Carol. The minutes were approved.

THE FINANCE COMMITTEE submitted by Larry Legro

The Budget Committee of Larry Legro and Candy Lauby, met with Church Treasurer Owen Raisbeck after worship on Sunday 11/17/24, and a budget was created for fiscal, calendar year 2025.

2024 budgeted for a total of \$100,380.00. In 2025, our anticipated expenses were increased to \$109,957.00, which is an increase of \$9957 over the 2024 budget. The biggest increase was for our property and liability insurances which now cost approximately \$19,000/year when in 2024 it was \$4800. We need to be aware of increased costs as the new year starts.

Your attorney can include it when you prepare or revise your will, or you can add a codicil at any time.

Gifts that do not restrict their use, or **unrestricted gifts**, allow Holy Trinity to use these resources where they are most needed. Of course, we are also grateful for gifts that are designated for a specific purpose that advances our mission, **restricted gifts**, such as support to a specific initiative or program. Or you could make a gift to the church's Endowment Fund. At a time when secular non-profits are realizing the need to build their endowments, churches are still asking for operating support only. An **endowment gift** helps move us into a more sustainable position.

You could also choose to designate a portion of the proceeds of your IRA to Holy Trinity each year. We have been grateful to members who have chosen this option as a way to make a sizeable annual gift.

You may now use our online giving, through holytrinitymarshall.com to make a gift directly to our Endowment Fund.

Another way to help Holy Trinity is to name the church as the beneficiary of your life insurance policy. This could convey assets in larger amounts without disrupting your current cash flow.

Quilts for LWR As quilt-making continues here at Holy Trinity, we always have an ongoing need for the supplies that go into making the quilts. Thank you to all our members and friends who keep an eye out for fabric that family members are disposing of and fabric that is available at garage sales and estate sales. We continue to request new bed sheets, used bed sheets, tablecloths, large pieces of fabric, etc. Even well-worn sheets are useful as the middle layer of a quilt. We welcome anyone who wants to get involved in making quilts either by meeting at church, by sewing at home or by cutting fabric squares at home.

One of our quilt groups meets at church 12:30 pm on the 3rd Tuesday of each month to sort donations, prepare donations for use in a quilt, and tie the layers of a quilt together. Our other quilt group comes to church on the 3rd Saturday of each month starting at 9:00 am. Sewing machines will be provided.

Please join in various quilt tasks on our quilt days for whatever amount of time you have to contribute. We are grateful for all the support we receive from our Holy Trinity family that allows us to donate quilts to the Lutheran World Relief mission of providing quilts to people in need in the US and around the world. **Please continue to provide new fabric that can be cut into squares for making quilts. It's then possible for someone to take the next step and cut 11-inch squares of fabric and donate them. **

ELCA MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS. Per Constitution and bylaws of the ELCA, a person must give a monetary gift and receive Holy Communion at least once every calendar year to be a member. Holy Trinity is required to keep records of both giving and communion. (If you put cash in the collection

plate, that is not a contribution of record. We need to know your contribution came from you. (There are extra contribution envelopes on the Welcome Desk.) Please fill out a communion card at least once a year and on the day that you commune. That way we can make a record of it. Place your last name and first name of each person taking Communion on the card along with the date. You may place the card in the offering plate or hand it to an usher. You may also request a visit from the Pastor on this card.
