That's good news because sometimes we might not feel peaceful, and we have no peace to pass. When we pass the peace at worship it's the peace of the Lord that we're passing. Christ not only has peace, he is the source of peace, and he has plenty to pass. We take it in faith, then, that it is Christ's peace we pass to each other. This is a peace which can bring healing for inner turmoil, or even mend a broken relationship. Good news, indeed.

Our annual Garage and Bake Sale on **August 12-14** is fast approaching. We urge you to tell family and friends to continue bringing clean donations of gently used items in good condition. Holy Trinity has a great reputation for



offering a well-organized sale that offers a grand display of worthwhile, valuable items. These items are popular with our customers: small and large furniture, tools, fishing equipment, sporting goods, books, and games. Please look around your homes and garages and ask your family and friends to do the same to discover no longer used or needed items to donate. These items should be placed in the east hallway of the church near the classroom on the right and outside the Sunshine Room. It may be possible to make special arrangements for the restricted items listed here. We cannot accept TVs, entertainment centers, mattresses or box springs, sofa sleepers and reclining sofas, futons, baby items (such as car seats, cribs, and walkers), large appliances, items that are prohibitively large and heavy to handle, and hazardous or construction materials.

Proceeds from the sale of **baked goods** add greatly to the success of our event. Donations of baked goods can be brought to the church kitchen on all 3 days of the sale. And, the garage sale display will be open to our members to shop before and after worship on Sunday Aug 15th. Find it, buy it! It will be free or you can make a free-will donation.

Update: Parking Lot Brat Fry: The planners for the brat fry are also gearing up for this great, added feature of our fundraiser that will happen from 10:00am-2:00 pm every day of the garage sale. Laurine Martin and her committee have a menu of tasty foods that will be available in the food tent: brats, hot dogs, chips, cookies, drinks and a "meal deal". It's critical that there be adequate help throughout the prep days and sale days of this event. Look for the worker schedule on the WELCOME desk in the church entry way. Note that we will need workers for cleanup and haul away on Monday, Aug 16 and Tuesday, Aug. 17, as well. Please commit to some work time so to make certain that all hours of the prep and sale days are covered. Also, take a few flyers and share them with family, friends, and the community. SECOND HARVEST MOBILE FOOD PANTRY

I am sad to announce that July will be the last month that Holy Trinity will formally be hosting Second Harvest Food Bank. This decision was made for several reasons. One reason was based on a change in the distribution of food. It is no longer pre-boxed so volunteers must bag or box up the food prior to its distribution. Another reason for discontinuing the Second Harvest sponsorship here was lack of volunteers to help distribute the food. Many of the volunteers were older and/or came from other places besides Holy Trinity. Due to COVID and its changes, many of those older volunteers did not return. A small core of "regulars" had been doing the boxed distribution but it is impossible for them to continue the new distribution system on their own. Therefore the difficult decision was made to discontinue the Second Harvest distribution in Marshall with Holy Trinity as its partner. It is my understanding that the Second Harvest distribution will continue in the high school parking lot at 3:30 p.m. on the 4th Friday of August (**August 27**). If there are Holy Trinity members who still wish to volunteer, they should arrive at the high school around 2:30 p.m.

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

Minutes from June 8, 2021 were corrected. Added to minutes 1. Gary is working on a diagram to show placement of fire extinguishers in the building. 2. Dan is getting quotes for the servicing of fire extinguishers.

It was noted on treasurer's report that Pastor's salary is lower because there is no need for housing allowance during the substitute pastor.

Pastor's Assistance Fund was discussed. Council decided to look into using a grant system.

Other churches use this type of system when help is needed. Dan will look into this.

Owen submitted a report on the copier lease we had planned to use. He found that the lease isn't financially good for our needs at this time. The printer we have is capable of running 5 million copies and we have 2.5 million left to use. Kathy now knows how to fix the recurring problem, with no recent service calls since September 2020.

The contract for the interim pastor is complete. He officially starts July 18th. Office hours Monday thru Thursday to start.

Dennis Woelffer has told Gary that Second Harvest will be done after July. Changes in the way food is put out and a lack of volunteers are two main reasons. Discussion was had with no solution. Working on Call Committee.

Planned Giving to Holy Trinity

One way to ensure a bright future for our church is to make a planned gift that names Holy Trinity in your will. Your attorney can include it when you prepare or revise your will or you can add a codicil at any time.

Gifts that do not restrict the use, or **unrestricted gifts**, allow Holy Trinity to use these resources where they are most needed. Of course we are also grateful for gifts that are designated for a specific purpose that advances our mission, **restricted gifts**, such as support to a specific initiative or program. Or you could make a gift to the church's Endowment Fund. At a time when secular nonprofits are realizing the need to build their endowments, churches are still asking for operating support only. An endowment gift helps move us into a more sustainable position.

You could also choose to designate a portion of the proceeds of your IRA to Holy Trinity each year. We have been very grateful to members who have chosen this option as a way to make a sizable annual gift. You may now use our online giving, through holytrinitymarshall.com, to make a gift directly to our Endowment.

Another way to help Holy Trinity is to name the church as the beneficiary of your life insurance policy. This could convey assets in larger amounts without disrupting your current cash flow.
