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## FROM PASTOR LISA

Someone I've known for a long time recently said that with the world as chaotic as it is, she just wants her church to be calm and comfortable. I've heard that before, but this time, I understood it better. Because the world seems so much more chaotic than ever before—at least in my lifetime. There will always be some things that are comforting at church and in worship. There is an order of service that doesn't change a lot from week to week and things that we say each time we come together. And there is music and holy communion: Two things that have always brought me comfort.

Sometimes the Biblical readings are comforting, but sometimes they aren't. Sometimes Jesus says things that sound controversial. Interestingly, I've preached on these same readings for over 30 years, and things that sound very controversial now were only mildly controversial a decade or three ago. The world is not only more chaotic than it has been, but it is also more polarized. People take sides more quickly now and are less likely to consider other opinions.

I think it's a good thing that Lutherans as well as other Protestants and the Roman Catholics use a series of assigned readings called the Revised Common Lectionary. These readings were chosen decades ago by a group of representatives from these denominations. They chose three years' worth of readings from the Bible, and every three years we start over from the beginning of this lectionary.

Sometimes these readings can be difficult. Sometimes it feels like Jesus is talking to us right now. And Jesus spoke his mind. Actually, he spoke God's mind. And he showed us who God is. Jesus hung out with people whom others didn't think were deserving of Jesus' company. He got in trouble for this. He got in so much trouble that he was eventually put to death. But Jesus, who was God in the flesh, was raised from the dead. So that we would know that everything Jesus did and said came from God, including God's allegiance to people who weren't considered as worthy as others. And Jesus was also raised from the dead so that we would know that nothing we could say or do would ever stop God from loving us.

Unfortunately, the more chaotic or polarized the world becomes, the more chaotic or polarized our congregations become. Because we, who live in this world, are the same people who are part of these congregations. BUT it is also the same God, yesterday, today, and tomorrow, who loves

us, each of us across this globe. And who wants the same things for everyone: A chance to both survive and thrive.

Here is a version of a prayer that has been prayed for ages. It's called Loving Kindness. It's a prayer I pray for you, as well as myself and my family. It's a prayer you can pray for yourself, your family, and even strangers around the world.

"May you be at peace and at ease. May you be safe and protected.

May you be healthy and well. May you love and be loved. Amen."

## JANUARY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS submitted by Carolyn Madaus

All members were present at the meeting held January 14, 2025. The December minutes were approved. President Gary Waalkens said he is pleased with the attendance at Wednesday worship. The December treasurer's report was reviewed and accepted.

Pastor Lisa said she was thrilled with both the Sunday School and Confirmation class Christmas programs. Hats off to Susy Pawl and Kathy Deneen. The next Sunday School will be January 26 after the Children's Message through the Annual Meeting so parents can attend. There will be no worship on Wednesday – April 16 as it is Holy Week. Because she is serving 2 congregations, Pastor Lisa

proposed doing a combined Maundy Thursday/Good Friday service at Holy Trinity on Thursday – April 17 at 6:30 and then doing St. Mark's worship on Good Friday. She is also going to see if she can do the Ash Wednesday service at St. Mark's on the Tuesday prior and doing Ash Wednesday at Holy Trinity on March 5 at 6:30. (First Communion will be celebrated on Sunday – April 6 and Confirmation is Sunday – May 4.) Pastor will be off Sunday February 9 and on vacation March 6-12. Motion made and passed to combine Maundy Thursday & Good Friday worship on Thursday – April 16 at 6:30.

In new business, Trina Byrnes decided not to take the office manager job and Kathy Schluter has agreed to fill in until April, when Karen Browne takes over after retiring from her full-time job.

At the Annual Meeting, Larry agreed to hand out microphones to people with questions and Kathy will have sign-up sheets for people to provide their names and contact information so we can determine whether there is a quorum.

Food and drink signs will be updated for the sanctuary.

Mike Chadwick asked if the Council would approve having a picture of June put up. The Council decided to approve that.

Discussion was held as to charging Scouts for large events. A mention was made of no charge for regular meetings but possibly for big events, or ask them to help with spring cleaning, etc.

Maintenance will be done on the copy machine tomorrow. We should renew the service contract.

WELCA asked if the Council needs to approve every event WELCA has. All events need to go through the Events Committee.

Meeting adjourned.

## FEBRUARY COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS submitted by Carolyn Madaus

Meeting was called to order and then an opening devotion. All members were present except for Carol Woldt.

Election of officers took place with President, Candy Lauby; Vice-President, Matt Stensven; and Secretary, Carolyn Madaus elected.

Council minutes from January meeting were reviewed and approved, as well as the minutes from the January 26, 2025 Annual Congregational Meeting.

Gary Waalkens welcomed Kathy Deneen and Matt Stensven to the Council.

The January treasurer's report was reviewed and discussion was held regarding employment taxes. Council needs clarification of the report and want Owen Raisbeck to attend next Council meeting and explain. Bank statements may be reviewed for an audit and possibly monthly basis.

Pastor Lisa advised Sunday School is held this coming Sunday and she will also be playing board games with the kids before worship on Wednesday February 19. They will be encouraged to stay for the kid-friendly worship service that evening. Lent is coming up. February 23 is Transfiguration Sunday and Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 5. Because Pastor Lisa is serving 2 congregations she asked if the Ash Wednesday worship could start at 7:00 pm instead of 6:30 pm. Council approved that time change. Palm Sunday is April 13 and Easter is April 20. There will be no Wednesday worship on April 16 but we will have a combined Maundy Thursday/Good Friday worship on Thursday April 17. No Wednesday or Friday worship service during Holy Week, only on Thursday April 17 at 6:30 pm.

No food or open drinks are to be allowed in the sanctuary. Styrofoam cups with lids or any other covered drink containers are allowed only for beverages.

A picture of a deceased congregation member was OK'd to be displayed for 2 months.

Council voted to discontinue Holy Trinity's subscription to the weekly Church Directory section of The Courier/now to be Sun Prairie Star.

Matt Stensven is liaison for the Scouts. Groups have a certain amount of clean-up expected of them. A recommendation was made to have a checklist provided to them and group leaders should check to make sure this is done. It was suggested to possibly have Scout groups help with Spring and Fall Clean-Up as Marshall High School students have done in the past.

The committee for the Endowment/Memorial Fund is Owen Raisbeck, Dan Timpel, and Todd Madaus. Donation checks should indicate where donors want the money to go. If they don't indicate that, the office will contact the donor(s) to clarify where they want their donation to go if they have a specific purpose.

Discussion was held on whether to continue with payroll through our current accountant and Council decided to continue that.

Kathy Deneen asked about Outreach, which will be discussed at a future meeting.

Gary announced that he has 5 youth signed up for First Communion instruction.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:00 pm. Next meeting is set for Tuesday – March 11 at 6:00 pm.

- 3. **Restricted gifts** are monies designated for a specific purpose that advances our mission, such as support to a specific initiative or program.
- 4. Give to the church's Endowment Fund. You may now use our online giving, through holytrinitymarshall.com to make a gift directly to our Endowment Fund. At a time when secular non-profits are realizing the need to build their endowments, churches are still asking for operating support only. An endowment gift helps move us into a more sustainable position. (Dan Timpel has joined the Endowment Committee, replacing Jack Erb. If anyone has questions or wants to make a donation to this fund or the Memorial Fund they should contact Dan Timpel, Todd Madaus, or Owen Raisbeck.)
- 5. You could also choose to designate a portion of the proceeds of your IRA to Holy Trinity each year. We are grateful to members who have chosen this option as a way to make a sizeable annual gift.

**Quilts for LWR** As quilt-making continues here at Holy Trinity, we always have an ongoing need for the supplies that go into making the quilts. Thank you to all our members and friends who keep an eye out for fabric that family members are disposing of and fabric that is available at garage sales and estate sales. We continue to request new bed sheets, used bed sheets, tablecloths, large pieces of fabric, etc. Even well-worn sheets are useful as the middle layer of a quilt. We welcome anyone who wants to get involved in making quilts either by meeting at church, by sewing at home or by cutting fabric squares at home.

One of our quilt groups meets at church 12:30 pm on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday of each month to sort donations, prepare donations for use in a quilt, and tie the layers of a quilt together. Our other quilt group comes to church on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday of each month starting at 9:00 am. Sewing machines will be provided.

Please join in various quilt tasks on our quilt days for whatever amount of time you have to contribute. We are grateful for all the support we receive from our Holy Trinity family that allows us to donate quilts to the Lutheran World Relief mission of providing quilts to people in need in the US and around the world. \*\*Please continue to provide new fabric that can be cut into squares for making quilts. It's then possible for someone to take the next step and cut 11-inch squares of fabric and donate them. \*\*

**ELCA MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS.** Per Constitution and bylaws of the ELCA, a person must give a monetary gift and receive Holy Communion at least once every calendar year to be a member. Holy Trinity is required to keep records of both giving and communion. (If you put cash in the collection plate, that is not a contribution of record. We need to know your contribution came from you.

There are extra contribution envelopes on the Welcome Desk.) Please fill out a communion card at least once a year and on the day that you commune. That way we can make a record of it. Place your last name and first name of each person taking Communion on the card along with the date. You may place the card in the offering plate or hand it to an usher. You may also request a visit from the Pastor on this card.
